



E.S.E. Six miles and 236 poles

The annexed plan represents an actual survey of a Township of land lying on the east side of Kennebeck River, two miles and one half to the Northward of Fort Halifax and two miles and one half to the southward of said Fort: the whole Township contains eighteen thousand two hundred Acres Pond and Sebasticook River included and bounded as follows viz. beginning on the east side of Kennebeck River at a hemlock tree standing on the bank of the River and one rod west north west of a large rock and two miles and one half of a mile on a North north east course from Fort Halifax From said tree to run east south east five miles to a beech tree marked there running south south west five miles and twenty eight poles to a red oak marked then running west north west to Kennebeck River, being about six miles and two hundred and thirty six rods to a red oak tree standing on the bank of Kennebeck River: then running northerly up said River as the shore lyeth, five miles and twenty eight poles to the bounds first mentioned. The external lines and the geography of the east side of the River were carefully taken and run and are laid down by a scale of eighty poles to an inch
